

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## Inngangur

Ráðist var í fornleifarannsókn í Urriðakoti vegna fyrirhugaðra framkvæmda á svæðinu. Rannsóknin var unnin fyrir Garðabæ og Urriðaholt ehf.

Fornleifaskráning fór fram árið 2005 og fornleifakönnun árið 2007 og 2008. Grafið var í Urriðakoti frá 3. maí til 15. júlí og frá 4. ágúst til 20. september sumarið 2010. Við rannsóknina unnu 13 fornleifafræðingar, fornleifafræðinamar og 2 aðstoðarmenn.

Þegar uppgröftur hófst í maí var gert ráð fyrir að ljúka verkefninu á 6 vikum. Uppgraftarsvæðið var áætlað 45 fermetrar á svæði A og 35 fermetrar á svæði B.

Á svæði A var snið sem sneri N-S og í því var ekki að sjá neinar mannvistarleifar eða mannvirki. Þegar ákveðið var að opna aðeins meira af svæðinu til að fá fullvissu um að ekkert væri þarna að finna komu fljótlega í ljós leifar skála frá landnámi til 11. aldar. Þar sem jarðvegur er rýr og upplásinn hafði vesturveggurinn á skálanum eiginlega að mestu horfið en hefði annars sést í sniðinu. Austurveggurinn var aftur á móti nokkuð heillegur. Þegar þetta lá ljóst fyrir var farið að huga að svæðinu sem lá á milli A og B. Þar hafði verið tekinn könnunarskurður sem leiddi ekki í ljós neinar minjar. Ekki var heldur neitt sjáanlegt á yfirborði. Skálafundurinn varð til þess að ráðlegt þótti að opna svæðið þarna á milli til að fá úr því skorið með ótvíræðum hætti

hvort eitthvað fleira leyndist undir sverðinum. Þá kom í ljós veglegt fjós, skemma og soðhola frá landnámi til miðalda.


Þessir óvæntu fornleifafundir hafa haft það í för með sér að ekki var hægt að ljúka rannsóknum á þeim tíma sem til stóð. Þarna er um að ræða stórmerkilegar minjar á bæjarstæði Urriðakots sem á sér ekki langa sögu í heimildum, en bæjarins er fyrst getið á 16. öld. Miðað við könnunarskurði, sem grafnir voru árið 2007, gat enginn átt von á því að þarna myndu koma í ljós svo umfangsmiklar minjar sem raun ber vitni. Margt bendir til þess að þarna hafi verið seljabúskapur en ekki föst búseta. Er það mjög áhugavert þar sem ekkert sel hefur verið að fullu rannsakað á Íslandi.

Rannsóknin fór fram undir stjórn Ragnheiðar Traustadóttur fornleifafræðings en uppgraftarstjóri var Margrét Valmundsdóttir, fornleifafræðingur og meistaranemi í hagnýtri menningarmiðlun. Inga Hlín Valdimarsdóttir, fornleifafræðingur og meistaraniemi við Stokkhólmsþáskóla, fleytti sýni og sömuleiðis Hrönn Konráðsdóttir, fornleifa- og skordýrasérfræðingur, sem einnig mun vinna að greiningum.

Eavan O'Dochartaigh, MA í fornleifafræði og griplateiknari, teiknaði snældusnúð sem fannst árið 2009. Þórgunnur Snædal hefur rannsakað rúnaletur á snældusnúð sem fannst sumarið 2010 í vegg frá 13. öld. Við úrvinnsluna unnu Margrét Valmundsdóttir og Lilja Laufey



Davíðsdóttir. Anna Rut Guðmundsdóttir vann að uppsetningu og umbroti á skýrslunni.

Erla Bil Bjarnadóttir, garðyrkjustjóri Garðabæjar, hefur verið rannsóknarteyminu innan handan með ýmis viðvik og er þakkað kærlega fyrir það góða samstarf.


Sigurjón Runólfsson gröfustjóri sá um að taka ofan af svæðinu og stækka uppgraftarsvæðið.

## Staðsetning og uppgraftarsvæði

Urriðakot er í Garðabæ og stendur bærinn í halla vestan í Urriðakotsholti fyrir miðju Urriðakotstúni. Uppgraftarsvæðið er neðan og sunnan við tóftir á jörðinni (sjá kort).

Uppgraftarsvæðinu var skipti í two hluta, A og B, og tóku þeir mið af könnunarskurðum sem voru grafnir árið 2007.

Uppgraftarsvæðið er orðið um 900 fermetrar að stærð.



## Aðferð - Intrasis

Við uppgröftinn á Urriðakoti hefur verið notuð aðferð sem kallast einingaraðferðin (e. single context recording). Hún er ekki algild á Íslandi en talin henta þar sem hefur verið búið á sama stað í langan tíma. Hún felur í sér að hvert mannvistarlag á svæðinu, hvort sem um er að ræða jarðlag, holu eða byggingarhluta, er skráð sem stök eining. Hver eining er síðan mæld upp með alstöð og fær hlaupandi númer. Hún er ljósmynduð og henni lýst á sérstökum skráningarblöðum.

Við rannsóknina er notuð alstöð sem í er hugbúnaður sem tengist gagnagrunninum og landupplýsingakerfinu Intrasis (Intra-site Information System, [www.intrasis.com](http://www.intrasis.com)).

Intrasis er hugbúnaður sem fornleifasvið þjóðminjavörslunnar í Svíþjóð hannaði og hefur verið notaður við fornleifarannsóknir á Hólum í Hjaltadal, Kolkuósi í Skagafirði og Keldudal í Hegranesi frá árinu 2003.

Við fornleifarannsóknina á Urriðakoti voru jarðfundnir gripir mældir inn með alstöð því að nákvæm staðsetning þeirra getur gefið ýmsar upplýsingar, s.s. um notkun húsanna sem þeir finnast í. Gripir eru ávallt tengdir við jarðlögin sem þeir finnast í úti á vettvangi þegar þeir eru mældir inn. Þeir eru síðan skráðir inn í Intrasis með fundarnúmeri, málum og þyngd, en nánari skráning fer svo fram þegar rannsókn lýkur á vettvangi.

Öll sýni eru mæld inn á vettvangi og tengd við þau jarðög sem þau eru tekin úr. Sýnum er

fleytt og þau greind nánar. Greiningar fara fram þegar uppgreftri lýkur árið 2011.

Í stuttu máli má segja að Intrasis haldi utan um allt sem viðkemur rannsókninni, vinnufl, gripi, jarðög, mannvirki, teikningar, ljósmyndir, upplýsingar um staðhætti o.fl. o.fl. Intrasis vinnur svo með öðrum forritum, s.s. ArcView, Access og Excel, sem notuð eru til margvíslegra greininga.

Uppgraftarsvæðið var sett inn í Reykjavíkur hnitakerfið. Voru jarðög, jarðfundnir munir, sýni og hleðslur mæld eftir hnitakerfinu, hæðarmæld, teiknuð og ljósmynduð. Gripir, jarðög, teikningar, ljósmyndir, greiningar o.fl. verða tölvuskráð í Intrasis.

## Mannvirki

Við uppgröftinn hafa komið í ljós 12 mannvirki sem virðast vera frá tveimur tímaskeiðum. Sérhverju er gefið sérstakt mannvirkjanúmer.

Öll mannvirkin frá eldra tímaskeiðinu (frá landnámi til 1226) eru á uppgraftarsvæði A. Þar fannst skáli [10], fjós [15], vinnsluhús [16], garður [13], eldhús? [14] og soðhola [17]. Nánari aldursgreining þarf að fara fram til að hægt sé að skera úr um hvort elstu minjarnar séu frá fyrstu tíð landnáms.

Frá miðoldum eða rétt eftir 1226 hafa fundist leifar af tveimur mannvirkjum [11] [12] á svæði A en á svæði B fundust leifar af baðstofu og búri [18], annarri baðstofu og öðru búri [21] og eldhúsi [20].

Ekki er ljóst hvort miðaldaminjarnar á svæðum A og B hafi allar verið í notkun samtímis. Hluti þeirra er byggður rétt eftir miðaldagosið 1226. Vonir standa til að hægt verði að aldursgreina þær enn nánar.


Þá fannst stekkur á svæði B sem er sennilega frá 19. öld [19]; hefur töluberðu af minjunum frá miðöldum verið raskað með gerð hans.

Auk þess hefur fundist miðaldamannvirki efst í túninu og töluvert fyrir ofan uppgraftarsvæðin. Það svæði verður rannsakað seinna en þar er gert ráð fyrir að byggja íbúðarhús.

Í skýrslu þessari verður ekki fjallað um öll mannvirki sem eru nefnd hér að ofan því að í einhverjum tilvikum er rannsókn nýhafin þótt þeim hafi verið gefið mannvirkjanúmer.

Almennt liggar ekki fyrir endanleg túlkun um hlutverk húsanna þar sem ekki hefur verið fullgrafið eða sýni greind. Til stendur að ljúka uppgreftri árið 2011.

## Uppgraftarsvæði og mannvirki



## Skáli [10]

Skálinn [10] er á uppgraftarsvæði A. Hann snýr norður-suður en hefur ekki að fullu verið grafinn. Áætluð lengd hans er 14-16 m að utanmáli.

Norðurhluti skálans hefur verið raskaður vegna vatnslagna sem lagðar voru úr dæluhúsi skammt fyrir ofan og austan hann niður í mýrina þar sem var brunnur. Lag sem lá yfir skálanum og inn í hann hefur verið túlkað sem þekja [21875] en gæti þó verið blandað gólfina. Enginn fannst langeldurinn og aðeins afar rýrt gólfag [27379]. Fyrir miðju skálans fundust sextán stoðarholur eftir þakberandi stoðir.

Austurveggurinn [27408] virðist heillegur og inngangur, að líkindum bakdyr, sunnarlega á honum. Aðalinngangur var trúlega á vesturvegg en lítið er eftir af honum. Hugsanlega hefur hann verið rifinn einhvern tíma í fyrdinni og orðið að víkja fyrir miðaldabyggingum á svæðinu, en rannsókn er ekki lokið á þessu svæði. Mótar fyrir seti [23056] á austurvegnum innanverðum og aftan við hann meðfram veggnum fundust tólf stoðarholur.

Örfáir gripir fundust inni í skálanum, perla (F:2011-26-130), ógreinanlegt brons og járnhnífur. Uppgreftri verður haldið áfram 2011.




Skáli [10]



Urriðakot 2011-26-130


*Perla sem fannst í skálanum [10]*

## Fjós [15]

Fjósið [15] er á uppgraftarsvæði A, sunnan við skálann [10]. Það snýr sem næst austur-vestur og hallar í vestur en hæðarmunurinn er um 45 cm.

Fjósið er tvístætt, um það bil 4 m á breidd og básalengd 1,05-1,20 m en breidd 1,00-1,20 m. Inngangurinn er á vesturgafli en það er hugsanlegt að einnig sé inngangur austanmegin.

Sennilega teygrir fjósið sig eitthvað áfram undir snið í því austanverðu en varla langt þar sem greina má að veggirnir eru farnir að lokast eða draga sig saman. Flórinn er steinlagður með

hraunhellum og kantsettum steinum fyrir framan básana. Í básumum hefur verið torf. Veggirnir eru nærrí eingöngu hlaðnir úr strengjartorfi og torfið í þeim inniheldur landnámsgjóskuna.

Suðurveggurinn í fjósinu [37500] er 11,9 á lengd og mesta breidd er 1,9 m. Norðurveggurinn [36945] er 9,5 m á lengd og breiddin 1,7 m. Ekki hafa margir gripir fundist í fjósinu, ein gul perla (F: 2010-26-126) og þrír járnaglar.

Þar sem fjósið er ekki fullgrafið er ekki á þessu stigi hægt að segja til um það hvort byggingarstigin séu fleiri en eitt og ekki heldur





hvernig það hefur verið nákvæmlega uppgreidd. Við lok rannsóknar komu í ljós stoðarholur og munu þær væntalega skýra betur hvernig þak og uppgreidd fjóssins hefur verið þegar uppgreftrinum vindur fram.

Samþyggjt við fjósið kom í ljós mannvirki [16] sem virðist vera jafnlangt og er suðurveggurinn [36945] sameiginlegur. Síðarnefnda mannvirkið var ekkert grafið og er því ekki meira um það að segja að sinni.

Bæði þessi mannvirki verða fullgrafin sumarið 2011.

## Soðhola [17]

Soðhola eða seyður fannst á svæði A, 15 m vestan við skálann [10] og fjósið [15]. Hún er 1,45 m í þvermál, næstum hringlaga og er full af brenndum steinum og kolum. Í henni voru lítið eitt af brenndum dýrabeinum.

## Mannvirki [18]

Mannvirki [18] er á svæði B en það er grjót- og torfhlaðið. Lengd þess er 4,82 m og breidd 2,10 m að innanmáli. Hlutverk þess er óþekkt en það má leiða getum að því að þetta hafi verið búr eða geymsla. Mannvirkið er frá því fyrir 1500 en Katla [9116] lá yfir stórum hluta af hleðslunum. Það er mjög illa varðveitt, upplásið og lá rétt undir yfirborði, en Katla 1500 var rétt neðan við grásrót á svæðinu. Tóftin hefur byrjað að blása upp löngu fyrir Kötlugos.

Hún snýr í norður-suður. Þar sem austurveggurinn er ekki að fullu grafinn er ekki ljóst hvort grjót hafi verið í ytri brún eins og

innri. Lokið verður við uppgröft á veggnum á vormánuðum 2011.

Austurveggurinn og suðurendi tóftarinnar eru best varðveittu hlutar hennar en í vesturveggnum virðist grjót hafa verið fjarlægt, sennilega á þeim tíma sem hætt var að nota mannvirkið. Torfleifarnar [25449] í vesturveggnum virðast eiga sér sama uppruna og torf í öðrum miðaldabyggingum á svæðinu. Í torfinu er miðaldagjóska. Torfhrun [25449] gæti verið úr veggnum eða þekju en það fannst innan við austurvegginn.




Jarðlög í mannvirki [18]

Torfið í austurveggnum [25317] er mjög þunnt og rýrt og blandað fokjarðvegi. Torfleifarnar er aðeins að finna í kringum steinana, annað er blásið upp, og ekki fannst nein miðaldagjóska í því. Ekki er ólíklegt að inngangur í mannvirkið hafi verið á vesturhlíðinni eða norðurenda því að vegghleðslan austan- og sunnanmegin er órofin.

Erfitt er að átta sig á hlutverki mannvirkisins en ekkert eiginlegt gólf fannst heldur eru öll jarðlög blásin og niðurbrotin, sem fyrr segir.

Á svæði B hafa fundist tvö önnur mannvirki frá svipuðum tíma, búnar [21] og eldhús [20].

Svæðið er ekki fullrannsakað en hlutverk mannvirkisins gætið skýrst þegar það hefur verið fullgrafið og niðurstöður greininga liggja fyrir.



## Mannvirki [19]

### Stekkur frá 19. öld

Mannvirki 19 er á svæði B og er það grjóthlaðið. Mannvirkið er talið vera stekkur sem heimildir eru fyrir að byggður var á svæðinu á 19. öld. Hann er 5,2 m að lengd og tæpur 1 m að breidd að innanmáli. Mannvirkið sker eldri byggingar, miðaldaeldhús [20] og búr [21], og hefur raskað hluta af þeim.

Tóftin snýr í NV – SA. Veggir hennar eru grjóthlaðnir með ytri og innri steinhleðslum. Á milli steinhleðsnanna var blandað jarðlag sem var mjög laust í sér [12724], [13560].

Jarðlagið var torfblandað en í því var einnig að finna gripi eins og gler, keramik, járnagla, við og flöguberg (e. schist). Mikið meira var af gripum í [12724] norðan könnunarskurðsins [300] heldur en [13560] sunnan hans. Líklega eru þessi jarðlög einhverskonar veggjarfylling á milli ytri og innri steinhleðsla.

Mjög stórt grjót var í ytri steinhleðslunum en minni steinar lágu utan stórgrytisins og á milli steina, líklega til að fylla upp í vegginn. Innri brún veggja lá nokkru neðar heldur en sú ytri en steinarnir voru álíka stórir.


Greinilegur niðurgröftur er inni í tóftinni og hefur innri veggjahleðslan verið hlaðin utan í niðurgröftinn. Niðurgröfturinn var fullur af steinum af sömu stærð og eru í stekknum. Líklega hefur stekkurinn verið felldur ofan í sjálfan sig eftir að notkun á honum hefur verið hætt. Aðeins neðsta steinaröðin í ytri veggjahleðslunni er eftir á sínum stað sem bendir til þess að steinarnir í fyllingu niðurgraftarins séu upphaflega úr ytri hleðslunni þó eitthvað af þeim gæti verið úr þeirri innri.

Tveir líklegir inngangar eru á stekkjarrústinni. Annar er á suðvestur hliðinni en þar er gat í steinhleðslunni. Hinn er á tóftinni framanverðri, í vesturhorninu, en þar er að finna nokkra flata steina sem gætu verið steinhlaðin stétt.

## Mannvirki [20]

### Eldhús

Mannvirki [20] er á svæði B og er það torfhlaðið. Mannvirkið virðist skiptast í two byggingarfasa og er yngra mannvirkið 2,46 m að lengd og 1,82 að breidd að innanmáli, en lengd eldri byggingarinnar er 3,20 m og breidd 1,79 m að innanmáli. Líklegt þykir að mannvirkið hafi verið notað sem eldhús og hugsanlegt er að það hafi tengst mannvirki [21], búrinu, en þau tengsl eru horfin að flestu leyti vegna byggingar 19. aldar stekkjar [19] ofan í tóftirnar. Tóftin er frá tímabilinu 1226 – 1500 líkt og mannvirki [21]. Katla 1500 liggur ekki beint ofan á tóftinni en

með hliðsjón af jarðlögum er hún töluvert eldri en 1500.

Mannvirkið snýr í NA-SV og inngangur í tóftina er á norðvesturhliðinni. Ekki var þaktorfið vel greinanlegt í tóftinni en [24780] var túlkað sem leifar af þaktorfi. Svæðið er mjög uppblásið og torfið niðurbrotið.

Að minnsta kosti sex gólfasar hafa fundist í eldhúsini. Svo virðist sem byggingin hafi verið minnkuð í seinni tíð en greinileg breyting verður á torfveggjum.

### *Yngri bygging*

Yngri torfveggurinn [27762] liggur í U-laga formi utan um athafnasvæði hússins. Línur veggjarins voru mjög skýrar nema suðvesturhluta hans. Þar var torfið mjög blásið og þunnt, þó að innri lína hans hafi sést vel. Torfið í veggnum var nokkuð óreglulegt og erfitt að sjá hvernig það var uppbyggt, en sitt hvoru megin við innganginn var þó hægt að sjá annað hvort klömbru eða hnaus. Mikið af miðaldagjóskunni 1226 var í torfinu á þeim stöðum sem torfið var vel varðveitt. Á öðrum stöðum var lítt struktúr á torfinu og eins og jarðvegur hefði verið notaður til þess að fylla upp í veggina.

Innan tóftarinnar var athafnasvæði og greinilegt að mannvirkið hefur verið notað til eldamennsku. Mikið var um blönduð kola- og

móöskulög ofarlega í byggingunni og þegar neðar dró kom í ljós greinilegri skipting á gólfþögum og eldstæði. Gólfþögur eru þykk og mismunandi að gerð en þó er alltaf sama skipulag á þeim; torfkennt gólf upp við veggi tóftarinnar, kola- og móöskublandað í miðju þess og grænleitt kolablandað gólf við og út um innganginn. Á afmörkuðu svæði í miðri tóftinni var mikið af móöskulögum.

### *Gólfþög*

Mörg gólfþög fundust í yngri fasanum í byggingu [20]. **Fasi I**, og þar með yngsta gólfþagið [25181], var mjög blandað, með móösku, kolum og brenndum beinum. Úti við veggina var meira torf. Undir [25181], í **fasa II**, urðu gólfín minna blönduð. Upp við veggina var torfblandað gólf [34416] og út við innganginn var grænleitt gólf [34383]. Í miðri byggingunni




*Gólfþagi [25181] í fasa I*

var brunasvæði [34339], mjög blandað móösku, brenndum beinum og kolum.

Undir þessum lögum voru önnur gólfög mjög svipuð þessum, **fasi III**. Torfblandað gólf var upp við veggina [34578], grænleitt gólf nálægt inngangi [34612] og kolablandað gólf í miðju tóftarinnar [39368]. Þegar þessi gólfög voru fjarlægð kom **fasi IV** í ljós. Þar var mjög afmarkað svæði með móösku [35217]= [34871], sem líklega var eldstæði yngri byggingarinnar. Kolagólf [34894] og torfblandað kolagólf [35370] lá í kringum eldstæðið og sem fyrr var torfblandað gólf [34831] upp við veggi og grænleitt gólf [34789] við inngang.

Uppröðunin á gólfunum er ávallt mjög svipuð. Um er að ræða brunasvæði í miðju hússins, sem verður skýrara og hreinna eftir því sem neðar dregur, og út frá því eru gólf með mikið af kolaleifum sem borist hafa frá eldstæðinu. Úti við innganginn hefur verið mikill umgangur en

minna af kola- og móöskuleifum hafa borist þangað þar sem það er fjær eldstæðinu. Upp við veggi tóftarinnar eru svo torfkennd gólf með lítilli mannvist. Þar hefur verið líttill umgangur og torf úr veggjum tóftarinnar hefur brotnað niður og samlagast gófinu.

#### *Eldri byggingin*

Eldri torfveggurinn [323] liggur mjög svipað og yngri veggurinn. Hann nær þó aðeins lengra í vestur og suðvestur heldur en yngri veggurinn [27762]. Meiri stríktúr virðist vera í eldri veggnum. Torfið var fjólublátt og virðist hafa verið byggt upp með hnausum eða klömbru. Mikið var af 1226 gjóskunni í veggnum og mátti sjá torf- og gjóskulínur samsíða ef litið var á vegginn ofanfrá. Suðvesturveggurinn liggur upp að mannvirkni [18]. Torfið í eldri veggnum líkist meira torfinu í mannvirkni [21]. Suðausturveggurinn er þó ekki eins þykkur og skýr og hinir.

### Gólfög

Gólföggin í eldri byggingunni voru svipuð og í þeirri yngri. Sumarið 2010 voru grafnir upp tveir fasar af gólfögum í eldri byggingunni. Í **fasa V** var þykkt kolagólf [38349] með mikið af mannvistarleifum; kolum, móösku, beinum og brenndum beinum. Það var mjög þétt við innganginn og líkt og í yngri gólfsum var það grænleitara við innganginn og minna um mannvistarleifar. Mikið var af blönduðum móöskulögum í laginu miðju. Í gólfaginu fannst brot af bökunarplötu. Samtíða kolagólfinu var torfkennt lag [38170] hringinn í kringum kolagólf, upp við veggi tóftarinnar. Eitthvað var lagið blandað kolum og ösku frá brunasvæðinu en í mun minna magni en í [38349]. Líkt og áður hefur kolagólf verið aðalathafnasvæði tóftarinnar en lítið hefur verið gengið á torfkennda gólfinu. Torf hefur

að öllum líkindum hrunið frá veggjum meðan tóftin var í notkun og blandast saman við gólf.

Undir þessum gólfögum kom **fasi IV** í ljós. Þar var eldstæði [38659] = [39429] = [40499] og svipuð gólfög og áður, kolagólf [40061] og torfkennt gólf [39590]. Eldstæðið var niðurgrafið og frekar stórt eða um 0,75 x 1,1 m. Við hliðina á því var 30 x 40 cm flatur steinn. Þykkt torflag var við suðvesturvegginn nálægt eldstæðinu sem er hugsanlega set en uppgreftri er ekki lokið á byggingunni og endanleg túlkun því ekki komin á hreint.


Nokkrir járngrípir fundust í mannvirkni [20], þar á meðal naglar. Einnig fundust nokkur brot af bökunarplötum í eldra byggingarstiginu og í gólf fasa IV, kolagólf [38349] og moldargólf [38170].




### *Önnur bygging?*


Austan við mannvirki [20], á milli þess og [21], hafa fundist nokkur kola- og móöskublönduð mannvistar�ög sem líkjast mjög þeim gólfum sem hafa fundist inni í byggingu [20] og hefur það bent til hugsanlegrar byggingar þar. Austurveggur [20] er sömuleiðs ólíkur hinum veggjum tóftarinnar, hann er ekki eins skýr og hinir veggirnir né eins þéttur og þykkur. Vegna þessa hefur verið sett fram kenning um hvort um sé að ræða millivegg. Ekki hefur fundist neinn torfveggur sem styður það, en uppblástur hefur verið mikill á svæðinu líkt og sést á suðausturveggnum [21]. Veggurinn gæti því allt eins verið horfinn og aðeins torfleifar og hrun eftir af honum. Sem fyrr segir liggar endanleg túlkun ekki fyrir.

### *Tengsl milli eldhúss og búrs*

Hugmyndir hafa komið upp um að tenging hafi verið á milli eldhússins [20] og búrsins [21] sem stekkurinn [19] hefur spillt. Í niðurgreftrinum í stekknum sést jarðvegssnið af jarðlögunum á svæðinu og þar sjást mannvistar�ög lík þeim sem eru inni í [20] og [21]. Í mannvirki [21] sést að neðsta steinaröðinn suðvestan í húsinu beygir út og liggar í átt að eldhúsini [20]. Gólflogin innan [21] beygja einnig út með steinunum. Þetta gefur til kynna að þarna hafi verið tenging á milli húsanna sem er horfin í dag. Ekki hefur verið klárað að grafa upp eldri bygginguna en því mun ljúka á vormánuðum 2011.











### Urriðakot - Svæði B Mannvirki 20 - fasi IV

## Mannvirki [21]

### Baðstofa og búnir

Mannvirki [21] er á svæði B og er það torf- og grjóthlaðið. Lengd þess er 6,91 (7,6) m og breidd 1,85 m að innanmáli. Mannvirkið var líklega notað sem baðstofa og búnir sem gæti hafa verið tengt mannvirki [20], eldhúsinu. Sú tenging er nú með öllu horfin vegna yngri mannvirkja og röskunar á svæðinu. Tóftin er röskuð af stekk sem byggður var á 19. öldinni [19] og jafnframt sker könnunarskurður sem gerður var árið 2007 tóftina í sundur. Utan þess er tóftin ágætlega varðveitt, þó að meira hafi séð á suðurveggjum

hennar sökum uppblásturs. Tóftin er frá því fyrir 1500, en Katla 1500 [1485] liggur yfir henni. Líklega hefur mannvirkið verið byggt fljótlega eftir 1226 því að tóftin liggur rétt ofaná miðaldalaginu svokallaða.

Tóftin snýr í norður-suður. Veggir hennar eru frekar vel varðveittir, sérstaklega norður- og austurveggirnir [320] (undirveggir [21007], [21037], [21073], [21110], [21145], [35776] og [35808]), og á mörgum stöðum má enn sjá hvernig torfið var uppbyggt. Þeir eru um 1,0-1,7 m á breidd, innihalda allir mikið af 1226

gjóskunni. Sumir voru byggðir með streng, aðrir hnausum eða klömbru og enn aðrir voru með samblund af þessu tvennu og hefur verið hlaðin innbrún úr steinum sem hefur verið ca. 30 cm á hæð en ekki eru neinir steinar í ytri brún veggjanna. Hleðslan upp við austurvegginn virðist þó vera eitthvað sigin inn í tóftina. Stór hluti vesturveggjarins og steinhleðslunnar sem líklega var þar er horfinn vegna 19. aldar stekkjartóftar [19] sem byggð var í mannvirkið. Inngangur er inn í tóftina og snýr hann í vestur. Hann er um 80 cm breiður.

Suðurveggir tóftarinnar [321] (undirveggur [39443]) eða [326] (undirveggur [39443]) og [322] eru ekki eins vel varðveisittir og nyrðri veggir hennar. Ekki er alveg á hreinu hvar syðsti veggurinn hefur legið, því að ekkert var eftir af honum í sinni upprunalegu mynd. Líklega hefur

hann þó legið utan steinaraðarinnar sem fannst í þessum enda, þar sem steinhleðslan hefur verið innan við veggina annarsstaðar í tóftinni. Þar fannst jarðlag með torfi og 1226 gjóska [39443] sem skilgreint var sem torfhrun. Þetta lag gæti hafa verið torfveggurinn en hrún og uppblástur hafa skilið lítið eftir af veggnum. Syðri hluti tóftarinnar stóð í brekkunni og því hefur fyrst farið að láta sjá á henni þar.

Þaktorf fannst ofarlega í byggingunni [10392], [11933] og [18683]. Torfþekjan var frekar uppblásin á köflum en þó mátti sjá rauðar/rauðgular þekjur á stórum pörtum þess. Var mun minna af 1226 gjóskunni í torfinu í þekjunni en torfinu sem fannst í veggjunum.

Í syðri hluta tóftarinnar innanverðri fundust tveir torfbútar [324] og [325]. Þetta torf var

nokkuð lægra en veggir tóftarinnar og hefur verið túlkað sem hugsanlegt set. Ekki fundust leifar af setum í nyrðri hluta mannvirkisins. Veggirnir í þessari tóft eru óvenju þykkir ef boríð er saman við mannvirki frá sama tíma á svæðinu, eldhús [20] og mannvirki á svæði A [12] og er þetta eina mannvirkið sem er með hlaðna innbrún úr steinum. Er ekki ósennilegt að menn hafi viljað einangra húsið vel ef það hefur átt að vera búr eða einhvers konar skemma þar sem matvæli voru geymd. Ekkert bendir til þess að þetta sé skepuhús en bíða verður með endanlegar niðurstöður þar til tóftin er fullgrafin og öll sýni greind.

#### Gólfloð

Í búrinu á svæði B voru skilgreindir þrí fasar af gólf. Yngsti fasinn, fasi I, fannst undir torfhruni frá veggjum og þaki. Um var að ræða tvö ólík

gólf sem voru þó samtíða. Báðir hlutar gólfins voru mjög þéttir í sér en í gólfínu meðfram austur- og norðurveggjum [21987] var lítil mannvist. Hitt gólfíð [22595] var enn þéttara í sér. Það var grænleitt/rauðgult og í því mikið af kolum, brenndum beinum, illa varðveittum fiskibeinum og einnig var að finna í því ösku- og móöskubletti. Líklega hefur [22595] verið sá hluti gólfins sem meira var gengið á en [21987] verið sá hluti sem notaður var undir geymslu. Í suðurhluta tóftarinnar fundust einnig gólfleifar frá þessum yngsta fasa [24565] og svipaði því mjög til [22595] þó að það hafi ekki innihaldið jafnmikið af beinum og kolum og enga móösku.

Fasi II var mjög líkur fasa I. Norðanmegin í tóftinni er grænleita/rauðgula gólfíð [23456] sem hefur verið gengið á og það brúnleita [23476] sem hefur að öllum líkindum verið

notað undir geymslu. Í sunnanverðri tóftinni var grænleitt/rauðgult gólf [39684] undir torfhruni [38514] og [39622], sennilega úr veggnum.


Fasi III er líklega elsti gólfafasinn í búrinu [21]. Miðaldalagið 1226 liggar undir því og það er „in situ”. Báðum megin við könnunarskurðinn var að finna tvö gólf frá sama tíma. Norðanmegin var allt með sama lagi og áður, [34939] var grænleitt gólf með mikið af kolum, brenndum beinum og illa varðveittum beinum. Sömuleiðis var eitthvað um móosku í þessu gólfí. Minna var af mannvist í brúnleita gólfinu [34726], sem hefur, eins og áður, líklega verið notað til geymslu á venjulegum búrlutum. Sunnan til í tóftinni voru einnig tvö gólf frá sama tíma. Bæði voru þau fitug og þétt í sér en annað [40000] var með þennan grænleita blæ og rauðgula. Hitt gólfíð [40039] var svipað en brún-gráleitt að lit. Vegna þess hve grænleita gólfíð líkist mjög gömlu mýrartorfi og rauðgulu blettirnir virðast vera járnútfellingar, hefur komið upp sú hugmynd að hugsanlega hafi mýrartorf verið lagt á gólf rústarinnar til þess að jafna gólfin eða einangra þau frá kulda og bleytu. Það hefur þá aðeins verið lagt á hluta gólfssins, þar sem mest hefur verið gengið. Þessi elstu gólfög voru ekki grafin upp árið 2010 og verður því endanleg túlkun að bíða vors 2011.


Tvær steinaraðir fundust upp og út frá austurvegg mannvirkisins sem mynduðu einskonar bogadregnar línur og er ekki ólíklegt að þetta séu hleðslur undir einhvers konar ílát úr tré sem ekki hafa verið látin standa á moldargólfinu, t.d tunnur eða önnur geymsluílát.


Í mannvirki [21] fundust nokkrir gripir, þar á

meðal snældusnúður með rúnaristum í torfvegg [321]. Tveir járngrípir fundust í jarðlagi [19494], frekar ofarlega í rústinni. Tveir aðrir járngrípir fundust í gólfagri [21987], einn í gólfagri [23456] og annar í gólfagri [34726]. Í gólfagri [39684], sunnan við könnunarskurð, fannst brot úr bökunarplötu. Í veggjarfyllingu í austurveggnum [22806] fannst einnig hluti úr bökunarplötu en hlutar af bökunarplötum hafa líka fundist í mannvirki [20], eldhúsinu.

Ekki hefur verið klárað að grafa upp tóftina að fullu en lítið er eftir og mun því verða lokið vorið 2011.








## Urriðakot - Svæði B Mannvirki 21 - fasi II

## Gripir og sýni

Við rannsóknina hafa fundist 119 gripir og mun nánari greining fara fram á þeim þegar rannsókn er að fullu lokið á svæðinu. Varðveisluskilyrði eru ekki góð fyrir lífrænar leifar og hafa því nær eingöngu fundist gripir úr steinum og málmi.

Meðal þeirra eru merkilegir gripir, fyrst og fremst snældusnúðar tveir, annar skreyttur og hinn með áletruðum rúnum. Fátítt er að finna gripi með rúnaristum á Íslandi. Auk þess hafa fundist tvær perlur frá 10. eða 11. öld, bökunahellur, brýni, sennilega innflutt frá Noregi, járnhnífar, naglar og ýmsar bronsþynnur.

Jarðvegssýni eru 111 úr stoðarholum, gólfögum og mannvistarögum sem stefnt er að því að greina þegar rannsókn lýkur. Búið að er fleyta 50% af sýnunum.

Örfá bein hafa fundist, helst tennur nema brunninn bein, enda skilyrði ekki góð fyrir lífrænar leifar svo sem áður getur. Beinin verða greind þegar rannsókn lýkur á vettvangi.

## Niðurstöður

Við uppgröftinn hafa fundist skáli, fjós, geymsla, búr og soðhola frá landnámi fram á 11. öld. Nánari aldursgreining þarf að fara fram til að hægt sé að segja hvort minjarnar séu frá fyrstu tíð landnáms en það er ekki útilokað. Frá miðöldum eða rétt eftir 1226 hafa fundist leifar af baðstofu, búrum og eldhúsi en ekki hefur komið í ljós neitt íveruhús frá þeim tíma sem bendir til fastrar búsetu. Er hugsanlegt að það sé á lóðinni tölувvert fyrir ofan uppgraftarsvæðið en þar fundust leifar af miðaldamannvirki þegar grafnir voru könnunaraskurðir árið 2007. Margt bendir til þess að þarna hafi verið seljabúskapur en ekki föst búseta. Er það mjög áhugavert þar sem ekkert sel hefur verið að fullu rannsakað á Íslandi.

Eftir er að grafa um það bil 40% af svæðinu og er gert ráð fyrir því í maí og júní 2011 með 10 fornleifafræðingum. Í framhaldi af því verður unnið að úrvinnslu gagna, sýnagreiningum, griparannsóknum, forvörslu og skýrslugerð. Auk þess verður unnið að tillögum um hvernig hægt verði að miðla niðurstöðum rannsóknarinnar til almennings með sýningu, skiltagerð, vefsíðu eða bæklingi.

[26604] is a cut inside structure [19], was probably made when the field needed to be levelled and the "stekkur" needed to be removed. The stones that formed the walls of the stekkur were pushed in this cut, instead of having to carry them away somewhere.

NB: The stones are really big and heavy (apx. 50x30 cm) so the filling of this cut mainly consists of these stones but also had some soil from the layers above covering the stekkur. This cut will probably get more clearer when or if the test trench [300] will be cleaned and possibly the cut [26604] will be connected to the other cut of the same sort, [23704] in the other end of structure [19], forming one big cut that was made for the structural stones.

After the disuse of the feature and the deposition of its fill [26694], a stake was placed. Whether this signifiese reparations of the structure or later use os not clear. See sketch in [26265].

Occasional inclusions of burned bones and concentrated patches of charcoal. Underneath is natural soil. Fully excavated.

[27408] was at first considered as an outer wall mainly due to the lack of structural remains and deposits of domestic nature at the SW. remains of a possible floor indicate that [27408] divides the structure internally. Nevertheless an outer wall of the structure further at SW was not Identified. Traces of a possible wall are found at approximately 5-6 meters of [27408]. However it is not clear whether these are associated to the structure. The distance between these structural occurrences are considered to be much longer than those found in typical structures of this period.

Possible remains of a wall at the S of [27408] do not provide further evidence as these are heavily truncated by a modern cut. In any case this occurrence has to be further investigated. Turf wall [27470] is situated at the NE side. [27408] and [27470] form a rather unusual, narrow angle (approx. 20° - 30°). Drawing a boundary between wall [27470] and its collapse has been unsuccessful mainly due to dry conditions. When this boundary is established and the collapse is dug away then the corner between [27408] and [27470] will be properly rectified. [27408] slopes down towards the SW. This was most possibly due to the natural slope that made the SW part of the wall collapse at a greater volume. Another hypothesis could involve the presence of a possible bench. The way in which [27408] was built is clearly visible when dry.

In other parts of the wall the turf is very badly preserved and they probably used soil to fill it up between the "good turf". The wall has a lot of 1226 tephra where the turf is clear.

Another turfwall [28275] seems to be going under this one on it's SW side and stretches down to structure [303]. Close to the floor

[25181] where it met the wall [27762] were some small charcoal traces.

This turfwall [27762] could be from approx. 1226-1500, because Katla 1500 was recorded on top of some layers close by (although not directly on top of structure [20]).

[28491] is Katla 1500 in-situ. On top was just the topsoil that the bulldozer took away. Fairly big patch when compared with other patches of Katla 1500 in-situ on site. Very coherent layer.

[28577] is the same layer as [28364], windblown brown silt with charcoal and degraded fragments of turf. Contained 1226 tephra in the western most part of the layer. Iron nail found below tephra. Settled down in the remains of structure [15] which must already have been a ruin by then.

Turf collapse [28600] mixed with windblown material and occasional charcoal at the top with increasing frequency in the lower boundary closest to the possible floor layer.

[28637] is the cut of the cooking pit. It is mostly circular in plan with a rather flat but concave bottom. The slope of the sides was moderate, they were also concave in shape. The cut is into natural soil and there seems to be no other cultural layers in the vicinity, except for [32296], which is an ash and charcoal layer most likely deriving from the pit. This would indicate that the cooking pit was kept a bit from the house and other activity.

Underneath that layer there seems to be a compaction of burnt bones, this is ca. 0,5 m in length (visible in the profile). Underneath the bone layer are the stones. There is very little soil in between them. Closer to the edges of the pit and its bottom there is ca. 5-10 cm thick layer of mostly charcoal and soot. Some of the charcoal pieces are rather big, ca. 2-5 cm. On the NW side of the pit the charcoal layer has what looks to be peat ash, though it could be that this is just the ground soil which has burnt. It is also possible that turf had been

put in the bottom of the pit when it was being used.

On the top on the SE side of the pit there is an accumulation of a charcoal layer ca. 10 cm deep. The turf soil covering the cooking pit has been “pushed” in between it in some parts. This most likely happened after it was no longer in use.

belong to the same wall.

If turfwall [27408] is the main turfwall of structure 10 and the inside of the structure is on the wall’s W side, it means the E side is outside of the building. That means turfwalls [28749] and [28812] are part of some fence or additional building, along with turfwall [27470].

Part of turfwall [28749] could be turf collapse and that would explain the odd shape of the wall. Landnámstephra is very distinct in the entire turfwall. In the N end of the wall at least three strengir are visible.

If turfwall [27408] is the main turfwall of structure [10] and the inside of the structure is on the wall’s W side, it means the outside of the building is on its E side. That must mean that turfwalls [28812] and [28749], along with turfwall [27470], are part of some fence or additional building. Some parts of [28812] could be turf collapse but it is though much more regular in shape than turfwall [28749]. Landnámstephra is very distinct in the entire turfwall but strengur is not visible as in turfwall

[28749].

Could also be collapse from the roof or the eastern wall which seems to have this organic turf from the swamps. The wall seems to be pretty whole but still parts of it most likely have been cut away when cut [25833] was made.

Just S of the layer is a possible posthole that was just discovered during cleaning of [29329]. The posthole is filled with what seems to be material very alike the deposit in [29329].

As the layer was removed it became a lot more turfy, reddish-grey turf. It is therefore possible that this in fact is not a floor but possible an inner structure inside the skáli, used to divide it into rooms. It is also a possibility that a natural gap/cut was there when the skáli was built and it was filled up with turf to even out the surface. The layer is at least about 20-30 cm thick so there was a gap/hole in the surface when the layer had been removed.

The material in the elevated part of the structure appears to consist of similar turf but perhaps less degraded than [30000].

[30606] is the fill of posthole [30595]. The fill was rather firm and pretty clear on the surface. It was a little bit mixed with Landnámtephra which could suggest that the collapse from the W wall of the skáli fell into the posthole after the post was removed.

[31098] is the fill of posthole [31088]. The fill is a little mixed with charcoals. Rather firm and no hollow space in the posthole but the fill was distinct on the surface.

Posthole [32263] is located SW of central isle of structure [15]. ~0,5m from wall [28400]. It is 0,45 m deep and only contained fill material in the bottom half. [33678] is a brown soil deposit - related to the row of stones positioned on top of it [308]. Possibly a repairment/support of the inner side of the wall of house [16]. Adjacent to house [15].

Posthole [33711] possibly for roofstructure. Placed next to paved floorsurface close to what seems to be an entrance at the SW end of structure [15]. ~ 0,3 m deep and 0,12m wide.

[34311] is a floor layer, situated in the NE side of structure [20], close to the possible entrance to it. This floor layer is contemporary with turf floor [34416] (included in that number are [26165], [34365] og [34444]) and burning area [34339] and [34181].

It is also connected to a burning area or a hearth in the middle of the house [34339] and [34181]. It lies up against the east wall of the house.

[34383] is a floor layer inside structure [20] in the NE end. It was underneath turf collapse [34365]. (included in that number are [26165], [34365] og [34444]) and burning areas [34339] and [34181].

Layer [34444] is very similar - close to the wall, to the east side of it. These two layers were not measured as one because they didn't connect - but are quite almost the same.

This layer was combined with similar layers [26165], [34365] and [34444]. They are all believed to be the same layer, a floor layer, and contemporary with floor [34383] and peatash mix [34339]. This layer was stretched out to cover the others.

or a hearth in the middle of the house [34339] and [34181]. similar and contemporary with [34416], inside structure [20]. It's contaminated with charcoal from the burning area inside the structure.

[34457] is a small floor layer, similar to floor layer [34383] which is right next to it. Greenish-grey in color and with occasional charcoal remains. This is one of many floor layers inside structure [20]. It is the same as floor layers [34525] and [34612] and will be lumped together.

It is below a very similar turf floor layer

[34416].

[34612] is a floor layer that stretches outside of the entrance of structure [20]. It is turf - especially on the NW side. It is rich with iron panning - probably in connection with the swamp turf. This floor and the charcoal one have probably been the activity area, where there was a lot of walking and activity going on, while the part up against the walls [34578] was not used a lot. The turf part of the floor is mixed with turf from the walls that must have fallen from them while time passed and that is the reason why it was treated as turf collapse at first. The floor layer has been interpreted as the same as four other floor layers [34457], [34525], [34634] and [34664]. They all have the same features, are grey greenish and with iron panning and have been lumped to layer [34612] so it covers all these four floors.

[34634] is a floor layer inside structure [20]. It is mostly in the entrance but reaches a little in to the house. It does have some charcoals in it but not much else, except for one iron nail. This floor is a lot different than the floors inside the building, probably because it is further

away from the cooking area. Inside the house the floors are more mixed with the peatash and the charcoals.

The context description for this layer was lost so other information, like the photographs were used to obtain some knowledge of this layer.

[34664] is a small floor layer close to possible entrance in structure [20]. It is very compact - probably because it has been walked on through time. It is full of traces of human activity but has no burns like the deposits on the south side of the structure. The layer has some iron panning where there was a turf lumpin this layer.

[34685] is a floor layer, very black in color with some specks of reddish-orangish peatash. In the middle of the layer there was a rather large speck of peatash. probably where the burning area was. There is a possibility that there is a fireplace in the middle of the structure, but there have been several layers removed, including ash, charcoal and peatash. The floor layer is contemporary with turf floor layer around the walls [34578] and a greenish floor layer in the entrance [34612]. Above it was a burning area [34339] = [34181]. There are no stones close to this ash

but it is obvious that both peat and charcoals had been burnt there very often. The middle of this burning area was probably a hearth, where most of the peatash is.

It is contemporary to floor layer [34789] and charcoal floor [34894], and the hearth in the area [34871] = [35217].

[34894] is a floor layer inside structure [20]. It is in the middle of the structure and stretches out towards the possible entrance. The layer was slightly underneath layer [34871], which was mostly ash and is where a possible fireplace is. [34894] is full of charcoal and contains some ash as well. This is possibly due to there being a fireplace in the middle of the room. [34894] contains less charcoal as it gets closer to the entrance, which could mean that where there is a denser charcoal layer it is closer to the fireplace and then it gets smeared out.

This layer is a part of the hearth in the earlier phase of the house and is the same as [35217]. [35217] is a bit cleaner peat ash than this layer but it was lumped together afterwards. It is contemporary with floor layers [34831],

[34939] is a floor inside structure [21]. It was at first believed to be a floor deposit but when starting to remove it, it seemed to be something else. Now we know it is a floor and belongs to building [21]. It is the third phase floor of the building, contemporary with [34726] and looks like it is the same as [40000] on the south, cut by the trench [300]. It is also contemporary with [40039].

N.B. This layer is contemporary and the same

as floor layers [40000] and [40039], that were revealed later than this floor. Floor layer [40039] is lying on top of 1226 tephra so therefore it must be concluded that [34939] does indeed belong to structure [21].

[35217] is a peatash layer inside house [20] in the cooking and burning area of the house. The peatash looks like it might have been burned in situ. It is contemporary with floor layers [34831], [34894], [35370] and [34789]. Peatash layer [34871] was lumped with this one, because it is believed to be parts of the same burning area. These are the oldest floor layers and burning area of the younger wall structure. The context description was lost so photographs, the digging book and interpretation were used to find information about the layer.

[35327] is a turf collapse from turfwall [27470]. The turfwall was first measured in June but the turf collapse was never defined due to lack of time. The collapse has now been defined and [27470] has been measured again. The wall and the collapse are very similar but there is however a slight difference in color and the

collapse is more mixed, while the wall has more regular lines of Landnám tephra. This part of area A was cleared with a machine so layer [29000] is the layer on top of [35327].

[36256], which is probably a natural layer, mixed with some human activity goes under both [35327] as well as turfwall [27470]. [36256] however does not go under turfwall [27408], which is the NE wall of the skáli. That can only mean that the skáli was built first and the area on its NE side was later used for some sort of activity.

**Id** =35370

**Name** =Torf/kola Gólfag

**Class** =Archaeological Object

**Subclass** =Floor

[35370] is a turf silt layer with some peat ash and charcoal. It is a part of the burning area of the house like [34894] but it is different because it is so mixed with the turf from the walls. It is somewhere between a turf floor and a charcoaly floor. It is contemporary with turf floor [34831], charcoaly floor [34894] and greenish floor [34789]. It is also contemporary with the heath in the area [34871] = [35217].

The context description was lost so the digging book, photographs and interpretation were used to gather informations about the layer.

[35443] is a floor layer inside house [20]. It is

very close to the cooking area and has inclusions of charcolas. It is probably the same floor layer as [37743]. It looks the same and there are no other layers in between them. The context description for this layer was lost so other information, like the photographs were used to optain some knowlege of this layer.

**Id** =35469**Name** =Stoðarhola**Class** =Archaeological Object**Subclass** =Cut

Cut [35469] is part of a posthole in turf layer [33962] which is an area for animals (bás). There was hardly any fill at all .

[35552] is a peatash deposit inside house [21]. It was not burnt in-situ. When the peatash was removed, it could be seen that a hole had been dug to throw the peatash in. It was on top of a greenish-orangish turf that is believed to be from the settlement.

[35776] is a possible turfwall, an outer wall of house [21]. It is a bit different from the other walls connected to the house because the structure is different. The structure is like very big squares, a little bit more like turfwall [21037] which has hnaus in it.

[35808] is a a turfwall, the same as [21110] and north of stone structure [305]. It is the outer wall of house [21], and the stones are the inner wall. The wall has 1226 tephra in it and purple turf lines like [21110].

[36025] is a small cultural layer, possible floor, inside structure [20], situated on the SE wall of possible entrance into the structure. The layer came slightly underneath stone [34566], which seems to have slid down, possible wen a part of the wall fell down. The layer was mid pinkish-brown with frequent charcoal inclusions and moderate inclusions of peatash and burnt bones. There was a clear boundary to the next layer, as that is turf. This layer could possibly have been larger on the E side, but it has been cut by test trench [300] or the stekkur (structure [19]).

[36241] is a small turfwall, just NE of turfwall [27470]. [36241] and [27470] were most likely part of the same turfwall but have been truncated by modern cuts. The walls probably form a turfwall that was a fence, built next to / up against structure [10].

**Id** =36256**Class** =Archaeological Object**Subclass** =Cultural layer

[36256] is a cultural layer, located E of structure

[10]. The layer is very mixed, all reddish-grey and the same color over the entire area the layer extends. The layer is mixed with charcoals all over but especially in the NW corner where there are also a few bones and teeth visible. The bones are very badly preserved and could not be collected but a few teeth were collected. Bones, both burnt and un-burnt, are visible through out the entire layer but are very badly preserved.

This layer is most likely an old surface layer mixed with some cultural activity. The layer goes under turfwalls [27470] and [36241] which suggests that the turfwalls are a later addition to the skáli. The area E of the skáli (structure [10]) could have been used as an outdoor area and later turfwalls were added to create a fence. The layer obviously does not go under turfwall [27408]. The layer has not been excavated and probably will not be since it lies straight on top of natural, undisturbed soil.

The layer is rather mixed with some turf, peatash, ash, bones and charcoal. There was one find in it, a small flake from a baking plate. There have been several of these small flakes found in this sturcture, indicating that this was perhaps a cooking area, though a hearth has not been found yet.

The reason why this layer is thought to belong to the 2nd phase, is that it was underneath the wall on the first phase. The walls are moving further SW in phase 2, compared to the phase 1 walls. The inside space was therefor smaller in the 1. phase than in the 2nd.
