

Services for individuals and families

The City of Reykjavík Welfare Division has put forward a plan of action due to conditions in the economic environment in Iceland. Solutions and offers concerning services to individuals and families in trouble have been mapped to ensure the dissemination of information. The first to be considered are the services of the Welfare Division, then come services provided by other institutes and community associations.



Service Centres of Reykjavík City www.velferdarsvid.is

The Welfare Division operates six Service Centres in Reykjavík neighbourhoods. Their role is to provide Reykjavík residents with interdisciplinary, uniform service on personal issues; advice to staff of preschools and compulsory schools; and other professional services to institutions and community associations in the neighbourhoods. Service Centres also cover prevention issues and various culture-linked social projects, as cooperation with institutions and community associations plays an important part in the running of Service Centres.

At Service Centres you can apply for:

- Financial assistance is offered to those who have income and assets under specific
 reference limits and is provided to those who cannot support themselves and their
 families without assistance. The assistance is independent of the number of children
 and housing expenses.
- Social home help service is offered to those who cannot cope with household duties
 and personal care without help because of impaired ability, family circumstances,
 illness, childbirth or disability. The service can involve social support, help with
 personal care and/or help with household duties. It is also possible to apply for food
 deliveries.
- Housing benefit is offered to tenants of residential accommodation who fulfil
 requirements of legal domicile, rental agreement and income. Special housing
 benefit is intended for those who are in difficult social and financial circumstances.
 The dispensation of special housing benefit is based on assessment of an applicant's
 circumstances.
- Social rented apartments are intended for Reykjavík residents who are in very difficult social and financial circumstances.
- Service apartments for the elderly are intended for people who need more help and support than it is possible to provide in an ordinary home but whose health has not become so bad that a nursing home is needed.
- **Various support solutions** i.e. assistance for the disabled, personal advice and support families for children.

- **Preschools**. It is also possible to get information on day carers in the locality.
- Driving and travel service for the elderly and disabled for those who, because of their disability, cannot use the public transport system and do not have access to their own vehicle.

Advice at Service Centres

The professionals who work at the City of Reykjavík Service Centres provide advice to individuals and families. The aim of the advice is to provide information and guidance on social rights and support due to social and personal difficulties. Consultants can also provide information on the possibility of other services and can refer people to the solutions that suit each and everyone. Reykjavík residents aged over 16 are also offered free educational and job counselling.

Social activities for adults

Community centres under the auspices of the City of Reykjavík Welfare Division number 16 and are open to people of all ages. A great variety of social activities are on offer, including art workshops, keep fit, card-playing and woodcarving. School and specialist services for children and teenagers

At the City of Reykjavík Service Centres, a group of professionals composed of psychologists, social workers and special education advisors works to provide

interdisciplinary advice and support to residents and neighbourhood schools to meet the special needs of children and their families. The specialist service for schools provides advice to school staff, parents and students according to need. The needs of the children can be totally different, ranging from severe disability to mild difficulties, or to something else that has an effect on education and adaptation in schools. The difficulties often revolve around impairment of children's skills to the pursuit of education, communication and behaviour.

If concerns are due to the upbringing conditions of children, the Reykjavík Child Protection Agency is consulted, which has the role of ensuring that Reykjavík children who live in unacceptable conditions obtain necessary help. Unacceptable conditions can arise because of neglect, incompetence or conduct of parents, or if it is feared that the child puts his/her health or development in danger through his/her behaviour. A group of professionals works at the Reykjavík Child Protection Agency and emphasis is laid on strengthening families in their child-raising role and applying solutions to protect particular children when appropriate.

Leisure for children and teenagers

Leisure centres for teenagers under the auspices of the City of Reykjavík are six in total (www.itr.is). The arena for the operation of leisure centres is leisure for all city residents, but the main emphasis is placed on activities for children and teenagers. Leisure centres see to the operation of community centres and after-school centres in their neighbourhood.

Community centres in Reykjavík number 20. Their main emphasis is activities for teenagers aged 13-16 (www.itr.is).

After-school centres exist at all of the City of Reykjavík compulsory schools, and are a total of 35 (<u>www.itr.is</u>). After-school centres offer diverse leisure activities at the end of the normal school day for children aged 6-9.

Sports associations offer various sports for children and teenagers. More information can be found on the web pages of the associations.

Courses – continuing education – adult education

Námsflokkar Reykjavíkur (www.namsflokkar.is) deals with those who have the least formal education in many different ways:

- · Educational and job counselling
- Special teaching in reading and writing

- Education at compulsory school level for people aged over 16
- Preparative courses for upper secondary school education
- Various longer and shorter educational projects in collaboration with others
- Icelandic courses for foreigners, in cooperation with other educational institutions

The Directorate of Labour in the capital area offers courses in the winter of 2008-2009 that concern looking for work and building self-confidence, while knowledge courses in various areas are offered in cooperation with various bodies.

Mímir-símenntun is a private company under the ownership of the Icelandic Confederation of Labour (ASÍ) which operates in the area of adult education and job training. The main aim of Mímir-símenntun is to offer courses for adults, develop courses and encourage people in the labour market to engage in continuing education and job development.

Impra is a centre of information and guidance for entrepreneurs and small businesses. Impra provides guidance to all entrepreneurs together with small and medium-sized companies in Iceland.

Reykjavík University has an open university where emphasis is laid on a diverse selection of practical courses and courses of study under the guidance of Icelandic and foreign instructors (www.hr.is).

The University of Iceland has decided to meet the needs of those who want to respond to changed circumstances in the labour market by starting a university course or adding to their previous education. (www.hi.is).
